Dear Parents and Carers,

We appear to have moved from summer into autumn rather quickly! Please ensure that your child has a suitable coat for playtimes as we go out in all weathers.

We have a number of events coming up so please check for further information in this newsletter.

We have also attached a letter about our inclusion statement and ask that you all take a moment to read this. Both our schools take pride in our inclusive practice to try to meet the needs of all children. This can be quite a challenge with limited school budgets as this affects staffing and resources. We want to be a school where parents and carers feel comfortable to come in and talk about queries or concerns so please feel free to contact the school office if you require any further information.

ATTENDANCE

We are disappointed to see that there has been a recent increase in term time absence. Please can we remind you that holidays are not authorised. All holidays taken in term time (of 10 learning sessions, which do not have to be consecutive) incur a penalty fine of £60 per child per parent. A session is a.m or p.m. Absences from school can affect learning progress so they are only authorised if your child is unwell, attending a medical appointment or family wedding or funeral. There may be an exceptional reason outside of these areas but this needs to be discussed with Mrs Brown or Mrs West.

A new school year marks a fresh start for children to reconnect with friends and it's a chance to reset their patterns of behaviour, including attendance. Every professional adult and parent that interacts with a child plays an integral part in supporting children back to school. The first days matter. Last year, of those absent for at least one day in this period, 55% went on to be persistently absent. There is wide agreement among health professionals and educational professionals that school attendance is vital to the life chances of children and young people. Being in school improves health, wellbeing and socialisation throughout the life course. The greatest benefits come from children and young people attending school regularly. The Chief Medical Officer and other health leaders have just written to schools on this, and their [letter](#) is available here.

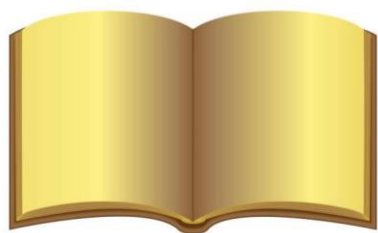

CENSUS DAY AND UIFSM - THURSDAY 5th OCTOBER 2023

On Thursday 5th October 2023, it is national School Census Day and, in an effort, to increase the uptake of the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on that day, the menu will be Fish and Chips. There will also be a jacket potato and sandwiches on offer on this day.

Census Day is when the Local Authorities collect information electronically from every school in their area, partly to guide them in planning and funding. They collect details such as pupil numbers, numbers of pupils with Special Educational Needs, entitled to Pupil Premium funding, entitled to Free School Meals, attendance information and so forth. One thing in particular they are looking at this term is the number of children taking the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM), to provide schools with appropriate funding for this service such as utility costs.

To maximise our potential funding, we would encourage all families with children entitled to UIFSM to enjoy their free meal on Thursday 5th October, rather than bringing a packed lunch that day. It is the number of children in Key Stage One eating the free meal on the actual day's lunchtime that informs our funding, rather than meals ordered for that day or children attending school. Pupils who bring a packed lunch from home unfortunately are not able to be included, nor are children who normally take UIFSM, but who are absent on 5th October. Once again, we encourage as many as possible to commit to eating the UIFSM on Thursday that week; this will record those children as having eaten on Census Day and therefore count towards the total Government funding that will be allocated to our school for UIFSM for a whole year. We hope that it will also create some enthusiasm amongst the children who don't normally take the meals and lead to more of them eating over the rest of the school year.

SAFEGUARDING

At Firle Church of England Primary School, safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility and our top priority. All professionals who come in to contact with children and their families have a role to play. Within school, we have a number of staff members who are responsible or leading on child protection and welfare. We would like take this opportunity to remind you of who to contact if you have a welfare concern about a child. If you are worried about a child's safety, please do not hesitate to contact any of the Designated Safeguarding Lead staff members straight away.
