We would like to thank her for all she has done for us and wish her well in for her future.

Sadly, Mrs Miller, who has been at Laughton for 23 years and Firle for 7 years, is going to retire at the end of the summer term. We are very sorry to see her leave but know she will have lots of fun in her retirement! BEECH CLASS VISIT TO A HINDU TEMPLE

During their RE days in terms 2 and 3, the children in Year 3/4 have spent time exploring Hinduism and what it means to be a Hindu in Britain today. To enhance their learning further, we have the opportunity for the children to visit the Crawley Hindu Temple, one of the largest Hindu Temples in the South East. On their visit, the children will be invited to observe a service and can participate (or not) in the service as directed, clap, ring the bell and offer the plate with a lamp on it. After this, they will hear a talk on the various Deities (Gods), the ornate Temple structure inside and the Hindu way of life and culture. There will be a demonstration of how the Sari (Indian ladies dress) is worn, a discussion on the Indian language and alphabet and comparison with English alphabet and finally an opportunity to perform a ritual clap and Bollywood dance. You will have received letters home this week. Please could you make sure that permissions are returned to the school office by Tuesday 23rd April.

Hair to be tied back at all times

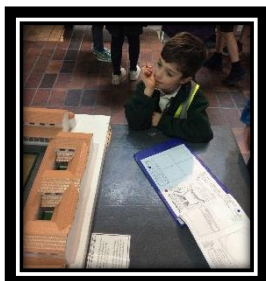

Beech class children had a fabulous time at Fishbourne Roman Palace before Easter, they dressed as Romans, ground flour and wrote in Latin on wax tablets.

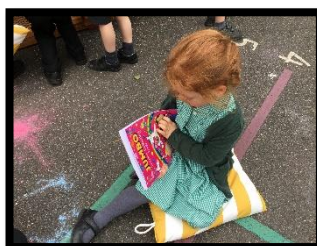
TOPIC WEBS AND HOMEWORK GRIDS
