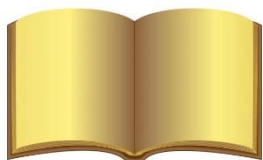
Dear Parents and Carers,

SCHOOL REMINDERS

Please can you make sure that all children have a coat and hat/scarf/gloves, suitable for the weather conditions. We will always try to get children outside in the fresh air at break times whenever possible.

Can we also remind you that we are a NUT FREE school and pack lunches from home must not contain any foods containing nuts, including chocolate spread, cereal bars etc. We continue to promote healthy eating in school and therefore ask that chocolate bars and sweets are not included in packed lunches. Small chocolate covered biscuits - Kit Kats, Penguin bars etc are fine. As a rule of thumb, if it is in the biscuit aisle, it is a biscuit; therefore ok in school.

CENSUS DAY AND UIFSM - THURSDAY 18th JANUARY 2024

On Thursday 18th January 2024, it is national School Census Day and, in an effort, to increase the uptake of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) on that day, the menu will be Fish and Chips. There will also be a jacket potato on offer on this day. Census Day is when the Local Authorities collect information electronically from every school in their area, partly to guide them in planning and funding. They collect details such as pupil numbers, numbers of pupils with Special Educational Needs, entitled to Pupil Premium funding, entitled to Free School Meals, attendance information and so forth. One thing in particular they are looking at this term is the number of children taking the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM), to provide schools with appropriate funding for this service such as utility costs. To maximise our potential funding, we would encourage all families with children entitled to UIFSM to enjoy their free meal on Thursday 18th January, rather than bringing a packed lunch that day. It is the number of children in Key Stage One eating the free meal on the actual day's lunchtime that informs our funding, rather than meals ordered for that day or children attending school. Pupils who bring a packed lunch from home unfortunately are not able to be included, nor are children who normally take UIFSM, but who are absent on 18th January. Once again, we encourage as many as possible to commit to eating the UIFSM on Thursday that week; this will record those children as having eaten on Census Day and therefore count towards the total Government funding that will be allocated to our school for UIFSM for a whole year. We hope that it will also create some enthusiasm amongst the children who don't normally take the meals and lead to more of them eating over the rest of the school year.

YEAR 4 SWIMMING LESSONS

From Thursday 11th January, our year 4 pupils will be attending swimming lessons at Wave Leisure in Lewes from 9.30 to 10.30am. They will travel to and from the pool by bus and will be back in school in time for lunch.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

If we need to close the school due to severe weather etc. then we will first put a message on our website and contact the Local Authority for our school name to be put on their school closures list on their website. We will also email parents and carers as soon as possible and encourage the message to be shared via What App groups. If the school needs to be closed, for any reason whilst the children are in school, we will email first and then start calling families to cascade the information. It is really important that we have the correct contact details for you so please make sure that any change in email, phone number or address has been received by the school office for our records, thank you.



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COLLECTION AT 3.15PM

Please let the school know if you have made arrangements for someone different to collect your child at the end of the school day. Without permission given to school, we are unable to release children with another adult. School pick up is at 3.15pm. Please do contact the school office in the event you are running late to collect your child.
